Prior to his current position, he was a full time and resident Research Associate at School of Political Science and Economics, Meiji University, Research Fellow at Institute of Administrative Management, and Research Associate at Research Institute of Economy, Trade and Industry. He holds a Ph.D. in Political Science from Meiji University. His research interests include comparative governance reform, performance measurement, budgetary management, and trust in government. Professor Moon is Underwood Distinguished Professor and chair of the Department of Public Administration at Yonsei University. Before joining Yonsei University, he taught at the Graduate School of Public Affairs in the University of Colorado at Denver (1998-2002), George Bush School of Government and Public Service in Texas A & M University (2002-2004), and the Department of Public Administration in Korea University (2004-2006). His research interests include public management, information technology/environmental policy, and comparative public administration. His research has recently appeared in major public administration and policy journals, including the *Technology Forecasting and Social Change*, *Governance*, *Public Administration Review*, *Journal of Public Administration Research and Theory*, *Public Performance and Management Review*, *International Journal of Public Administration*, and *Administration and Society*. He was Book Review Editor for *Public Administration Review* (2002-2005) and is currently serving Editor-in-Chief of *International Review of Public Administration* (2008-present). He is the recipient of Mosher Award for the best article in *Public Administration Review* as well as the Peter Boorsma Award for International Scholar in 2009.



Dr. Danilo de la Rosa Reyes

Dr. Danilo de la Rosa Reyes is currently Professor at the National College of Public Administration and Governance of the University of the Philippines in Diliman, Quezon City where he has served as a full time tenured faculty during the past 24 years.

He teaches courses on administrative theory, administrative history, organization studies, human behavior in organizations and introductory courses in Public Administration.

Dr. Reyes holds a Bachelor of Arts degree major in Political Science and Master and Doctorate degrees in Public Administration, all from the University of the Philippines.

He also received a Diploma in Managing the Development of Public Sector Activities from the University of Aston in Birmingham, United Kingdom in 1981. In 1994, he did fellowship studies at the Maxwell School of Citizenship and Public Affairs of the Syracuse University, New York, United States of America.

Dr. Reyes has also published papers on public administration and is often called upon to serve as consultant in government agencies. He also occasionally presents papers in international conferences and lectures in training programs of various government institutions. He also serves as issue editor of the Philippine Journal of Public Administration.

Dr. LooSee Beh is Senior Lecturer at the Faculty of Economics & Administration, University of Malaya, Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. She holds a PhD in Training Management, M.A. in Political Science, and BA. (Hons.) in History and Political Science. Her research focus is on human resource management, public administration, public policy, organizational behavior, and political economy. She has been a Visiting Scholar at Griffith University, Australia. She has published both locally and internationally. Her current publications include fifteen chapters in books, twelve refereed international journals, over thirty monographs, working paper series, and proceedings. She sits on the editorial board of Contemporary Management Research Journal and its International Coordinator & Liaison for the Conference on Business and Information.

She has been teaching both undergraduate and postgraduate students in the area of human resource management, communication in politics and administration, public administration, and policy analysis and program evaluation. Overall with 23 years of teaching/professional working experience of which 8 years have been spent in the tertiary education. She is also on the Board of Qualifying Candidates for Postgraduate Studies in indentifying suitable candidates, has been working with PhD/MPA student supervision in indentifying project, research methodology, and data analysis appropriate for the respective levels. She has also been appointed an External Examiner for a PhD Thesis for University of Wollongong, Australia and manuscript reviewers for international journals. Also on membership boards of international associations such as International Political Science Association, Global Studies Association, Malaysian Association of American Studies, NGOs such as Green Productivity Association Malaysia, etc. In recognition of her contribution, she had been awarded excellent service certificates and awards in the university.

Associate Professor Jeannette Taylor teaches public policy and administration in the School of Social and Cultural Studies at the University of Western Australia, Australia. Her research interests lie in performance measurement, performance information utilization, and public HRM. Her recent publications have appeared in *Public Administration*, *Public Management Review*, and *International Public Management Journal*.



Dr. King Kwun TSAO

Professor King Kwun TSAO teaches in the Department of Government and Public Administration at the Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK). He received a Ph.D. and a M.A. in Political Science from University of Chicago, a second B.A. in Politics at the University of California, Santa Cruz, and a B.A. in Philosophy at the Chinese University of Hong Kong. Over the years, he was visiting scholars at Harvard University (1996), Stanford University and University of California, Berkeley (2005), and a Senior Associate Member at St Antony's College, and University of Oxford (2001), among others. He is also a Visiting Research Fellow for 3 years (2009-2012), at The University of New South Wales, Australia.

Dr. Tsao is an expert on Chinese public personnel reform, public policy, and administrative reforms. He is the first few scholars to publish on the Chinese civil service reform in the prestigious journal Public Administration Review. The first article was entitled “Chinese Public Administration: Change With Continuity During Political and Economic Development” in 1995 (co-authored with John Worthley). Subsequently, more articles on the same intellectual endeavor have been written and published: Australian Journal of Public Administration (1995), Administration and Society (1999) and two articles in Public Administration Review (2009), just to name a few.

Professor Tsao is now serving in the editorial boards of Public Administration and Management and the Chinese Public Administration Review (CPAR). He has been the referee for many journals and academic presses: The Chinese University Press; Research Grants Council, Hong Kong Government; Asian Survey; The China Quarterly; China: An International Journal; Chinese Public Administration Review; Journal of Public Affairs Education; National Singapore University Press; Korean Journal of Public Administration; University of Pittsburgh; Public Organization Review; and Nanyang University of Singapore.

Dr. Tsao has presented papers to and has been invited by numerous academic institutions and professional organizations. Some recent ones include: University of Chicago (2010); University of Pittsburgh (2010); The International Association of Schools and Institutes of

Administration (IASIA, 2009, 2008 and 2007); Thailand's Ramkhamhaeng University (2009); American Society for Public Administration (2009); Australia's University of Technology, Sydney (2009); China University of Political Science and Law (2008); Sun Yat-Sen University (2008); China National School of Administration (2008); China Institute for Reform and Development (Haikou, 2008); Fudan University (2008,); Japan's MeijiGakuin University (2007); Shih Hsin University (2007); Fo Guang University (2007); City of Amsterdam, Netherlands (2007); University of Leiden, Netherlands (2007); Renmin University (2006); Japan's Chiba University (2006); University of California, Berkeley (2005); Peking University (2005); Chinese Public Administration Society (2005); Singapore International Foundation (2005); among many others.

For administrative matters, Dr. Tsao has been serving as an executive member of the Hong Kong Public Administration Association. He was also a council member of the Hong Kong Political Science Association and an executive member of the International Relations Committee of the American Public Administration Society. He was the founding member of the Hong Kong Public Administration Association.
